Thank you for applying for this scholarship, we are excited to support you on your journey!

This scholarship opportunity is available for current & past SDA participants two-and four-year academic programs as well as certificate/licensing programs. Multiple one-year scholarships are available, each in the amount of \$2,500, to support you on your journey through higher education.

The Julia and Guillermo Avila scholarships are awarded to students navigating increased obstacles or barriers in their pursuit of higher education. The Virginia Czaplá scholarship will be awarded to a student with a high level of service to their community. Scholarship applications must be resubmitted annually for additional funding.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All students who apply for the SDA Scholarship must be either:

- Current SDA Student
- SDA Alumni

All students who apply for the SDA Scholarship must also be one of the following:

- Graduating high school senior (Spring 2026) at the time of application
- OR Enrolled in college and/or will be enrolled in college for the upcoming Fall semester

All students who apply for the SDA Scholarship must submit approved household income documentation such as:

- Recent Pay Stub(s)
- Proof of income letter provided by an employer
- FAFSA
- Other proof of income approved by the Hispanic Alliance

Application Opens: January 12, 2026

Application Closes: February 13, 2026

Notice of Award: April 1, 2026

- 4 Recommendation via a Google form will be sent to your reference in 3-5 business days.

REVIEW OUR RUBRIC

NEW APPLICANT EVALUATION GUIDELINES

1

Essay (20%): Clear storytelling, adherence to prompt, and minimal grammatical errors. The essay should vividly illustrate personal experiences, demonstrating how challenges were managed and what insights were gained.

2

Leadership and Service (20%): Applicants should showcase leadership and service in their community or extracurricular activities. Evidence of at least one impactful contribution is expected.

3

Recommendation (20%): Letters should express confidence in the applicant's readiness for college, highlighting their strengths and potential for success.

4

Financial Hardship (20%): Financial circumstances are considered. Applicants from households with incomes below 100% of poverty guidelines receive the highest score, while those above 200% receive the lowest.

5

Interview (20%): Effective communication, engagement, and professionalism are essential. Clear articulation, thoughtful responses, and a polished appearance are valued.

*Recommendations are required. Failure to receive a letter of recommendation (LOR) results in a final score of 0.**

Financial hardship verification requires documentation of household income.
